



1. The Church building in 2001. The foundations have been laid but the building is still not finished due to lack of funds. (the donor passed away in the same year in a flood accident). The building is located at PERADAM TRIBAL COLONY, where tribes and forestry people live without knowledge of salvation as explained in the Bible, without education, culture, clean water or sanitation etc.. There are several tribal colonies surrounding this village which is located near to a forest area.

Our vision is to develop these tribal colonies, keeping Peradam village as our centre. The ministry, children's' home, charity work (care for the elderly and disabled) progressed well for 6 years. We saw very good progress in these tribal colony people and in others, but after our sponsor's death, all the work stopped. We are unable to develop or maintain these works that are for the glory of God. If we had regular financial support then we could start up all these works again where they are most needed for the sake of His kingdom.

The missionaries who have worked with us were able to raise funds for our works. Please consider if God is giving you a burden for these ministries in India, and seek sponsors for these works which remain unfinished.



2. This is Sathyavedu Children's Home which was started by Lt.Hon.Bro.J.C.Bailey of Canada in the year 1968 and which was supported by Lt.Hon.Bro.&sis.B.J.Howton of Houston USA up until March 2001.

This is PERADAM TRIBAL CHILDREN'S HOME which was started in the year 1996 for the tribal childrens' education, and other important needs like accommodation, food, clothes, school needs and healthcare and especially to teach the Bible so that they might know salvation in their early years. Sis. Mary Helen Dorothy is teaching both education and Bible teachings to these people.

I lead the worship along with other co-evangelists and preachers in all the congregations. Unfortunately we are unable to continue so the children are experiencing great suffering. This people's daily wage is less then \$1/US per day as for many other poor people groups in India; if there is no work, then there is no food for their family and children.



4. The Peradam Children's Home. The children are returning from school to the children's home compound which is located in a very small mango garden which was donated by Sis. Mary Helen.



5. Sis. Mary Helen, dedicated servant of God who lives by faith is taking a Sunday Bible class for the tribal children at Peradam in front of the unfinished church building. We believe God will finish His House with the help of his servants worldwide.
